Consistently ranked among the world's top universities, The University of Queensland (UQ) offers award-winning teaching, world-class indoor and outdoor learning environments, and outstanding facilities. Of UQ's +55,000 student population, more than 21,500 are international students.

As a student already enrolled at an accredited university outside Australia, you can explore your interests and talents by studying at UQ for one or 2 semesters. With more than 3,500 high-quality courses on offer, UQ is one of the most comprehensive universities in Australia. Many of these courses offer theoretical or practical components unique to UQ. Numerous courses focus on Australian topics or offer field trips to fascinating locations in South East Queensland, while others promote group project work, research opportunities or enhance employability.

Study Abroad students have the option of choosing the standard 4 course (full-time load) Study Abroad program, or the 3 course program at a reduced tuition fee. Incoming Exchange students can choose either 3 or 4 courses.

Whatever you choose, your UQ experience will help shape you into a well-rounded global citizen able to inspire change in others.

Where is UQ?

UQ offers one of the best campus experiences in the world in a location renowned for its welcoming, safe, and relaxed lifestyle, subtropical climate and vibrant and diverse culture.

Brisbane is the home of UQ's St Lucia, Herston and Dutton Park campuses and the capital city of Queensland. Innovative and progressive, the city is a thriving global centre in Asia-Pacific for business, investment, technology, major events, and education. It is also home to over 200 nationalities and 220 languages.

Gatton, the largest town in South-East Queensland's Lockyer Valley, is the home of the UQ Gatton campus. Bordered by unspoilt mountain ranges and located only one hour's drive from Brisbane, Gatton has a culturally diverse population of approximately 7,000 people. UQ Gatton students enjoy a laidback, country lifestyle in a close-knit community.

Queensland is Australia's second-largest state by area, and is home to some of the most important natural sites in the world, including the Great Barrier Reef. The state boasts pristine beaches, coral reefs, rainforests, mountain ranges, and outback towns. One of the best ways to discover these is to enrol in a UQ course with a field trip.

Choose your courses

Most of UQ's 3,500 courses on offer are open to Study Abroad and Incoming Exchange students, but some require permission from the relevant UQ faculty or school prior to enrolment. For courses you list on your application, UQ's Study Abroad and Incoming Exchange Advisers will request permission on your behalf, and you will receive a report with your letter of offer indicating which courses have been approved.

Follow these simple steps to find courses:

Go to my.uq.edu.au/programs-courses

Enter a search term in the search bar – you can search by course code or area of interest – and choose 'Courses' from the drop down menu on the right-hand side to explore available courses.

7 Refine your search

On the search results page go to the left navigation menu and select as many filters as you want: for example, refine your search to include only pre-approved courses for Study Abroad students and/or courses offered in a particular semester.

TIP: if you do a new search, you will have to refine it again.

7 Click on a course code or title

Check the level of the course (undergraduate or postgraduate), and which semester and campus it is offered: click on the semester for course description.

Check the course description page

Here you will find a short description of the course as well as a link to a detailed course profile: if the course is pre-approved for Study Abroad and Incoming Exchange students, there will be a note on the sidebar on the left stating this (if the course is not pre-approved, you must meet the prerequisites to apply). To access additional course information such as learning objectives, resources, activities and assessment, click on the most recent course profile link in red.

NOTE: Most Clinical Health Science courses (Medicine, Dentistry, Physiotherapy, Occupational and Speech Therapy and Veterinary Science) are not available for Study Abroad or Incoming Exchange students.

Entry requirements

To meet UQ's entry requirements for the Study Abroad or Incoming Exchange programs you must:

- have completed at least one full-time year of study at an accredited university
- be currently enrolled at an accredited or exchange partner university
- meet specific course prerequisites for admission into certain courses
- meet UQ's English language proficiency requirements
- hold average to above-average results in university studies to date
- for Incoming Exchange students be nominated by your home university.

Please ensure that all information is complete and correct and matches the information on your passport.

Note: The 3 course option is not a full-time study load at UQ but it does satisfy the student visa requirement. Check with your home university that you are permitted to take a reduced load before selecting this option.

Your application must also include the following uploaded documents:

- an up-to-date official academic transcript in English
- proof of English language proficiency, if applicable, and
- a photo copy of the ID page of your passport.

English language support

Bridging English (BE)

If you do not meet UQ's English language requirements, you can improve your English language skills at our on-campus English language college prior to starting your Study Abroad or Exchange semester.

WRIT1001 and WRIT1005

These are UQ credit-bearing courses (2 units each) for students wanting to improve their grammar and academic writing skills. WRIT1005 is offered in Semester 2 only, but WRIT1001 is offered in both semesters.

Prepare for arrival

Orientation Week (O-Week)

O-Week is a great introduction to life at UQ and is held one week before semester starts. You can browse clubs and societies, listen to live music, meet new and interesting people at events, pick up free stuff, and most importantly, attend your program's welcome session.

Visa information

All international students applying to study in Australia must have a student visa unless they have an alternative visa that enables them to study full-time. Your student visa will allow you to work up to 48 hours every 2 weeks.

When applying for a student visa, you must meet the Genuine Student requirement criteria (immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-listing/student-500/genuine-student-requirement) and have sufficient funds to pay your tuition fees, living costs (and the living costs of any dependants, if applicable) for the duration of your studies. study.uq.edu.au/university-life/getting-prepared-to-come-to-australia/student-visas

Health insurance

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) provides international students with basic cover for medical and hospital care costs while in Australia. OSHC is a compulsory requirement for a student visa. UQ can organise OSHC for you through its preferred provider.


