

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Doctor of Medicine Graduate Entry Admissions Pathway

UQ's Doctor of Medicine (MD)

There are two application processes available for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander applicants who have completed, or are in their final year, of a minimum 3-year bachelor's degree or approved post graduate degree (key degree).

GEMSAS online application

Direct application to UQ

This alternate entry pathway welcomes Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to apply directly to the University's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island Unit who will, in consultation with the Faculty of Health, Medicine and Behavioural Sciences, evaluate an individual's suitability for admission to the MD. They will consider professional experience, academic performance, personal qualities and motivation to study medicine.

Entry Requirements

You're eligible for the entry pathway if you:

- have completed a key degree*, or are in your final year of, a bachelor's degree or equivalent
- are an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander person
- have successfully completed the subject prerequisite courses**
- attend a semi-structure interview facilitated by the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies Unit
- attend a multiple mini interview (MMI) in the year you apply

Your study experience

For all 4 years of your MD program, you can preference a location to be based in:

- Greater Brisbane
- Central Queensland Rockhampton, plus limited clinical placements in Gladstone
- Wide Bay Bundaberg and Hervery Bay
- Darling Downs Toowoomba

^{*}A completed a key degree (e.g. Bachelor degree) from an accredited institution within the last 10 years or be currently completing the final year of their key degree.

^{**}The two prerequisite courses: Integrative Cell and Tissue Biology (BIOM2011) and Systems Physiology (BIOM2012) or equivalent. For <u>more information click here</u>. Application Process

Applicants are encouraged to contact the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies (ATSIS) Unit at atsisaltentry@uq.edu.au to express their interest in applying for admission to the MD program.

Follow these steps to apply:

- Complete and sign the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander admission pathway application form. The form will be available here in April, with applications open from mid-late April.
- Provide copies of the following documents:
 - A <u>Confirmation of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander status</u> from an incorporated community organisation. A statutory declaration accompanied by supporting materials may be considered. Original or certified copies of CoAs and/or supporting documentation must be provided. For more information contact the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies Unit at atsisaltentry@uq.edu.au.
 - Academic transcripts or certificates from previous enrolments in education courses or programs, and any supporting documents relevant to your application.
 - If you have lived in a regional or rural location for 5 consecutive years or 10 accumulative years, attach evidence.

Once you have all your documentation ready and your application is complete, email it to <u>atsisaltentry@uq.edu.au</u>. Applications close for this admissions pathway on the **1 August** in the year prior to admission.

Application Outcome

Once the admission process concludes, applicants will receive email correspondence with the outcome of their application. Those accepted to the Doctor of Medicine program, will commence their studies in early February of the following year.

Applicants who are yet to complete their key degree or satisfy the prerequisite requirements, will receive a conditional offer with a due date. Outstanding requirements must be fulfilled by 31 December of the application year.
